

The Edgewood ISD Board of Trustees is publishing this Notice of Public Meeting to discuss the proposed total \$1.344 tax rate for the 2012-13 school year. The increased maintenance and operations tax rate of \$1.17 is projected to generate an additional \$250,000 in annual state revenue for Edgewood ISD.

In an effort to both maximize state funding and not raise the upcoming school year's total school tax rate, if the Edgewood ISD voters approve the \$1.344 tax rate at the October 20, 2012 tax ratification election, the Board of Trustees intends to set the debt rate \$0.13 lower to make the final total tax rate for the 2012-13 school year \$1.214.

Voter approval of this tax rate would result in the same overall tax rate of \$1.214 as was present in the 2011-12 school year.

NOTICE OF PUBLIC MEETING TO DISCUSS BUDGET AND PROPOSED TAX RATE

The Edgewood Independent School District will hold a public meeting at 6:30 PM, August 6, 2012 in Edgewood HS Library. The purpose of this meeting is to discuss the school district's budget that will determine the tax rate that will be adopted. Public participation in the discussion is invited.

The tax rate that is ultimately adopted at this meeting or at a separate meeting at a later date may not exceed the proposed rate shown below unless the district publishes a revised notice containing the same information and comparisons set out below and holds another public meeting to discuss the revised notice.

Under state law, the dollar amount of school taxes imposed on the residence homestead of a person 65 years of age or older or of the surviving spouse of such a person, if the surviving spouse was 55 years of age or older when the person died, may not be increased above the amount paid in the first year after the person turned 65, regardless of changes in tax rate or property value.

Notice of Rollback Rate: The highest tax rate the district can adopt before requiring voter approval at an election is \$1.213999. This election will be automatically held if the district adopts a rate in excess of the rollback rate of \$1.213999.
